The story of Streetsville is written on the Trinity Anglican Church cemetery's gravestones – some lives that were long and fruitful, others that were cut short by wars and childhood diseases. Three members of the militia who served in the War of 1812 are buried here, along with several pioneering founders of the community. The cemetery is a designated War of 1812 Historic Site.

After nearly 180 years of time and weather, this historic jewel in the heart of Streetsville needs restoring, polishing and resetting to meet the needs of our contemporary community.

The Sam and Hazel McCallion Prayer

Garden is a highlight of the comprehensive cemetery restoration plan.

Sam and Hazel McCallion worked closely with the business community for many years to build our city. Their efforts brought about the growth and development that made our community an economically diverse and vibrant magnet for people from all over the world.

Now, it's time to reflect on their contributions and honour them with a beautiful grace note in the form of this prayer garden.



Honouring our builders

Sam McCallion helped build this community. Not with bricks and mortar, but with communication and spirit. He was the publisher of the local newspaper, *The Booster*, which became part of *The Mississauga News*, and founded Streetsville's famous Bread and Honey Festival. Sam was a deacon at Trinity Church for several decades, and is buried in the Trinity cemetery.

Hazel McCallion served as Mayor of Mississauga from 1978 until her retirement in 2014 at age 94. Before becoming Mayor of Mississauga, she was Reeve and Mayor of Streetsville. She has been a member of Trinity Church since 1957. It's entirely appropriate that the prayer garden honours two people who have done so much for our community.

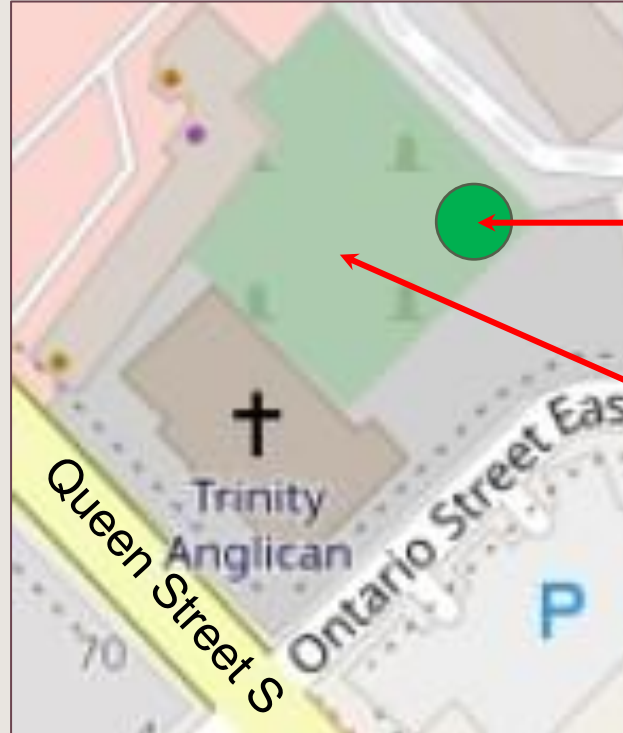


Find the Trinity Streetsville Cemetery

The Trinity Streetsville Cemetery is located at 69 Queen Street South in the village of Streetsville in Mississauga, near the intersection of Queen Street South and Ontario Street East.

The Sam and Hazel McCallion Prayer Garden will be in the southeast corner of the cemetery.

Parking is on the southeast side of Ontario Street. The cemetery and Prayer Garden will be open during daylight hours, seven days a week.
